
Jesus Was Born

BIBLE PASSAGE: Matthew 1; Luke 2; John 1

KEY PASSAGE: John 1:29

BIG PICTURE QUESTION: What did Jesus do to save us?

Jesus lived a sinless life, died on the cross, and rose from the dead.



Mary was engaged to be married to Joseph. One day, an angel told Mary she was going to have a very special baby. The angel explained, "This baby will be God's Son." Then an angel appeared to Joseph in a dream. The angel said, "Don't be afraid to take Mary as your

wife. Her baby was put there by the Holy Spirit. Name Him Jesus because He will save His people from their sins!" This was amazing news! Jesus—God in the flesh— would come as a light into the dark world.

Mary and Joseph lived in the town of Nazareth. 
