Jesus Called His Disciples

BIBLE PASSAGE: John 1
KEY PASSAGE: John 1:29

BIG PICTURE QUESTION: What did Jesus do to save us?

Jesus lived a sinless life, died on the cross, and rose from the dead.



The day after John baptized Jesus, John saw Jesus coming toward him and he said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" Jesus was the One John had been talking about—the One who was greater than John, who existed before him. "This is

the Son of God!" John said.

The next day, John was standing with two of his disciples. When he saw Jesus passing by, he said, "Look, the Lamb of God!"

John's disciples heard this and followed Jesus. Jesus saw them and asked, "What are you looking for?"

They said, "Teacher, where are you staying?"

"Come and see," Jesus replied. So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day.

One of the two who followed Jesus was named Andrew. Andrew found his brother Simon and said, "We have found the Messiah!" Andrew brought Simon to Jesus. When Jesus saw him, He said, "You are Simon, son of John. You will be called Cephas" (which

is translated "Peter").

The next day, Jesus decided to go to Galilee. Jesus found Philip and told him, "Follow Me."

Philip was from the same town as Andrew and Peter. Philip went to





Nathanael and said, "We have found the Messiah—the one Moses and the prophets wrote about. He is Jesus, the son of Joseph, from Nazareth."

"Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Nathanael asked.

Philip answered, "Come and see."


When Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward Him, He said, "Here is an Israelite who can be trusted."
