Today, we'll learn that **"Jesus Came to Be the Sacrifice for Sin"** (Hebrews 10). *Jesus came to be the sacrifice for sin. He lived a sinless life, died on the cross, and rose from the dead. In Him, we have complete forgiveness once and for all.*

Review the gospel and encourage your child to speak with you if they have questions. Lead your child to understand that Jesus' sacrifice is complete and is fully able to bring us salvation. Help them understand that we do nothing to earn our salvation. Remind them that good works do not save us, but our faith does produce good works in us that we are able to live our. Then pray, praising God for sending Jesus to be the sacrifice for our sin. Jesus's sacrifice was always God's plan to provide salvation for those who believe.

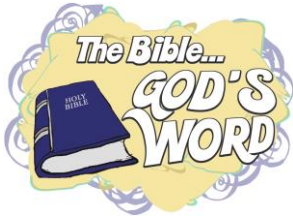
Jesus Came to Be the Sacrifice for Sin

BIBLE PASSAGE: Hebrews 10

KEY PASSAGE: John 1:29

BIG PICTURE QUESTION: *What did Jesus do to save us?*

Jesus lived a sinless life, died on the cross, and rose from the dead.

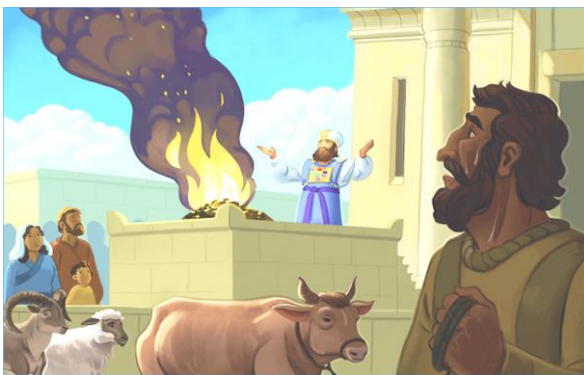


God first gave the Israelites His law through Moses so that they could understand that God is holy. The law showed that people are sinners. The law could not save the people, but it was like a shadow—hinting at something greater.

Under the law, the people offered sacrifices for their sins. But they were still guilty. It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins.

Jesus came to be the ultimate sacrifice for sin. He came to do God's plan, ending the old way of sacrifices by offering Himself as the perfect sacrifice—once and for all.

Under the law, the priests stood day after day, offering the same sacrifices. But those sacrifices never took away sins. But Jesus came to offer Himself one time. Then He sat down at the right hand of God. With one sacrifice, Jesus takes away the sin of everyone who trusts in Him.





The Lord said, “I will never again remember their sins and the wrong things they have done.” Because God forgives our sin, we no longer need to make a sacrifice to pay for sins.

Because all this is true, God calls us to live in a way that honors Him. He invites us to come to Him with boldness and without fear. Jesus’ blood has made the way for us to have hearts that are clean and without guilt. Jesus makes us pure when we have faith in Him. He gives us hope, and we can tell the world about it. We can trust Him to do all He has promised.

We can help one another do what is right by loving others and doing good works. We can meet together and encourage one another because one day, Jesus will come again..
