Dear Parents,

I'd love for you to use this newsletter to review this week's Bible story with your child at home.

This week, we'll learn about **"Peter Healed a Man"** (Acts 3). *Jesus told His followers to go and share the good news of the gospel with the world. But He did not expect them to do this alone. Jesus sent the Holy Spirit as their Helper and promised His power would allow them to be His witnesses. We will learn how God used Peter to heal a man through the power of the Holy Spirit and how this helped lead others to God.*

Review the gospel and encourage your child to speak with you if they have questions. Tell your child that God loves when we follow in obedience to His command to tell others about Him. Remind your child that we tell others about Jesus so they will hear and believe the good news. Share that when we share the gospel by serving others, we demonstrate a heart that has been changed to look more like Jesus. Then **pray, asking God for opportunities to tell others about Him this week.**

Peter Healed a Man

BIBLE PASSAGE: Acts 3

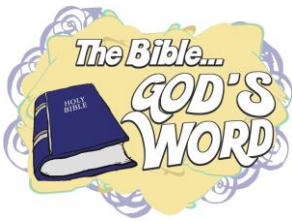
KEY PASSAGE: Romans 10:14

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

Why does God command Christians to tell others about Jesus?

We tell others about Jesus

so they will hear and believe the good news.



One afternoon, at 3 o'clock, two of Jesus' followers—Peter and John—went to the temple to pray. They saw a man sitting by the temple gate called Beautiful. Every day, the man's friends carried him to the temple because the man could not walk. As people entered the temple, the man asked them for money since he couldn't work.

When the man saw Peter and John, he asked them for money. Peter and John said to the man, "Look at us." The man looked at Peter and John, expecting them to give him something.

Peter said, "I don't have any silver or gold for you, but I will give you what I do have." Then Peter said, "In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, get up and walk!"





Peter reached out and helped the man up. All of a sudden, the man's feet and ankles were strong. He could walk! In fact, the man jumped and leaped around! He went into the temple with Peter and John, and he praised God. The people in the temple saw that the man was healed, and they were filled with awe and astonishment at what had happened to him.

After Jesus returned to heaven, the Holy Spirit gave the disciples power to begin working. With the power of Jesus' name, Peter healed a man who was lame. Peter and John showed God's power and pointed to a greater, spiritual healing found in Jesus.
