When the religious leaders tried to stop the gospel from being shared, Peter and John continued to boldly share their faith. They faithfully continued to share the gospel so that more and more people would hear the good news.*

Review the gospel and encourage your child to speak with you if they have questions. Remind your child that we must be faithful to share the good news with the world. God wants to use us so that others can hear the truth of the gospel and be saved. Share that when we pray for boldness, the Holy Spirit empowers us to share our faith. Then **pray, praising God for the Holy Spirit and asking Him to help us share our faith boldly.**

Peter Continued to Preach

BIBLE PASSAGE: Acts 4

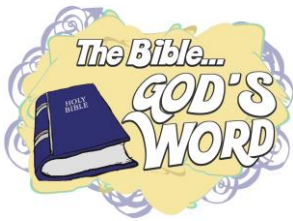
KEY PASSAGE: Romans 10:14

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

Why does God command Christians to tell others about Jesus?

We tell others about Jesus

so they will hear and believe the good news.



Peter and John were at the temple. Peter had healed a man and was preaching. The religious leaders came up to them. They were annoyed that Peter was teaching about Jesus, so they put Peter and John in jail until the next day. Still, many of the people who heard their message believed in Jesus and were saved.

The next day, the religious leaders got together along with the high priest and his family. Peter and John stood before them, and they asked, “By what power or in what name have you been healing and teaching?”



Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit. He said to them, “Are you asking us about the healing of the man who could not walk? Are you asking who healed him? We want you and all the people of Israel to know that he was healed by the power of Jesus. You nailed Jesus to a cross, but God raised Him from the dead. It is because of Him that this man is healed!”



Peter told the religious leaders that they rejected Jesus because they thought He was not important, but He is the most important One of all.

The religious leaders were amazed, and they didn't know what to say. They ordered Peter and John to never preach or teach in the name of Jesus again.

Peter and John said, "We cannot be quiet. We must tell people about what we have seen and heard." The religious leaders had no reason to punish Peter and John, so they let them go. Peter and John met with other believers and prayed that God would give them power to speak boldly and without fear.

Peter continued to preach about Jesus even when it was difficult. Not even the religious leaders could stop Jesus' followers from sharing the good news about Jesus. The gospel is great news that we must share if we believe in Jesus Christ.
