Dear Parents,

I'd love for you to use this newsletter to review this week's Bible story with your child at home.

This week, we'll learn about **"Peter Performed Miracles"** (Acts 9). *When Jesus was on earth, He performed many miracles. We will learn how His power was at work in Peter and allowed him to perform miracles. God's church had grown and Peter visited with believers in different cities. The Holy Spirit was at work through Peter to help others trust in Jesus.*

Review the gospel and encourage your child to speak with you if they have questions. Remind your child that when Peter healed Aeneas, he said it was Jesus who really healed Aeneas. Discuss how Peter did not seek to make his name great but wanted all glory to go to Jesus. Also, death is not the end for those who place their faith in Jesus. Jesus rose from the dead, conquering death so all believe in Him have the gift of eternal life. Remind your child that as people were healed or raised to life, many trusted in Jesus. Then **pray, praising Jesus for His power to heal and to save.**


Peter Performed Miracles

BIBLE PASSAGE: Acts 9

KEY PASSAGE: 1 Corinthians 12:12


BIG PICTURE QUESTION: *What is the church?*

The church is all Christians everywhere, who gather together in their communities to worship and serve God.



Peter had become a leader in the early church. Through the Holy Spirit, God's power enabled him and Jesus' other apostles to heal people and to speak boldly about Jesus the Messiah. During this time, the church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and was strengthened. Jesus' followers honored God, and the Holy Spirit encouraged them. More people joined the church.

Peter was traveling from place to place. He visited the Christians living in a town called Lydda (LID uh). In that town was a man named Aeneas (ih NEE uhs). Aeneas was paralyzed and had been bedridden for eight years. Peter said to Aeneas, "Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you. Get up and make your bed," and immediately Aeneas got up. When this happened, many people saw that Aeneas was healed and turned to the Lord.





In the city of Joppa (JAHP uh), there was a follower of Jesus named Tabitha; she was also known as Dorcas. She was always doing good works—helping people in need and making clothes for widows. Over time, Dorcas got sick and died. The disciples in Joppa sent two men to Lydda to get Peter.

Peter went to Joppa. He went upstairs in the house where Dorcas' body lay. Peter sent Dorcas' friends out of the room and knelt down beside her body. Peter prayed and then said, "Tabitha, get up."

She opened her eyes, saw Peter, and sat up. Peter called for the disciples and friends, and they saw that Dorcas was alive! This miracle became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.

When the Holy Spirit gave Peter power to perform miracles, people saw what happened and believed in Jesus. These miracles remind us of Jesus' miracles, which proved He is the Son of God who came to bring salvation to the world.


REMINDER
